FROM THE RECTOR

The Art of Healing

Ever since I arrived eight years ago, we've had a Wednesday service at 12:05 pm. The service was going on long before I arrived, and I'm grateful for it. Like many Episcopal churches, we offer the opportunity for members of the parish and others in the community to receive Holy Communion during the week.

When I first moved to Buffalo after college and worked downtown, I often attended the noonday service at the Cathedral. I found the intimacy of the Oratory Chapel and the small size of the congregation to be of real spiritual support as I began my life in the "real world," and I will always be thankful to the congregation that there was a service I could attend in the middle of a busy workday.

The number of people who attend the Wednesday service here at St. Luke's varies from week to week – sometimes only one other person is present in addition to the celebrant, sometimes as many as ten or fifteen people come. In addition to celebrating the Holy Eucharist, the service has a healing component. During the prayers, we remember – by name – every person on the parish prayer list. We pray a Litany of Healing together, and we offer a time when people can come forward to pray for themselves or for someone else and then be anointed by a priest with holy oil for healing.

If it sounds old-fashioned to you, it is. The church has been praying for the sick, and anointing and laying hands on those who ask for this ministry since the earliest days of the church. Our *Book of Common Prayer* has a service called “Ministration to the Sick” (p. 453-461) that contains various elements we include in our Wednesday services. It also has some quite beautiful prayers – prayers for use by someone who is sick, prayers to be prayed by others for the sick – both adults and children, prayers before an operation, even prayers for doctors and nurses.

Although we live in a time when medical science has made enormous advances, many still welcome what the church has to offer – that the ministries of prayer, of sacred touch, and of presence help – that God’s gifts of courage, strength and confidence assist us in bearing up when we suffer – that there is a spiritual aspect to life that must be attended to when illness strikes as well as a physical aspect.

Healing comes in many ways and in many forms. Doctors, nurses, pharmacists, therapists, chaplains and clergy are all part of the team that provide comfort and relief, restore health, and give hope. When our daughter, Kate, had her knee surgery in March of 2010, we were glad to have doctors and nurses caring for her as well as a priest sitting with us in the waiting room at OSU-East. Having both a great surgeon

in the operating room and a good priest in the waiting room gave us confidence that all would be well.

On Sunday, October 16, we’ll celebrate St. Luke’s Day. (St. Luke’s official day is on October 18, but it’s hard to get people to come to church on Tuesdays!) Tradition has it that Luke was a physician, so it seems appropriate that we highlight the church’s ministry of healing as we honor our Patron Saint.

At all three morning services, we’ll offer the Litany of Healing in place of the usual Prayers of the People. And at the end of each service, I will be at the altar rail to offer the Laying on of Hands and Anointing. People can come to ask

for prayers for themselves or for someone else. We’ll simply ask for your prayer request, anoint you with the sign of the cross on your forehead, and lay hands on your head while praying for you and/or for others. No one has to come, but some may want to come.

Of course, we’ll continue to offer prayers and the Laying on of Hands and Anointing at the Wednesday 12:05 pm services each week. And we’ll continue to pray by name for those whose names you give us for the parish prayer list.

By the way, if you want to participate in this important ministry of prayer, copies of the parish prayer list are on the bench at the rear of the church each Sunday morning and throughout the week. Prayer “warriors” are always welcome in our healing work.

Father Applegate will lead a short service and all pets will receive a blessing.

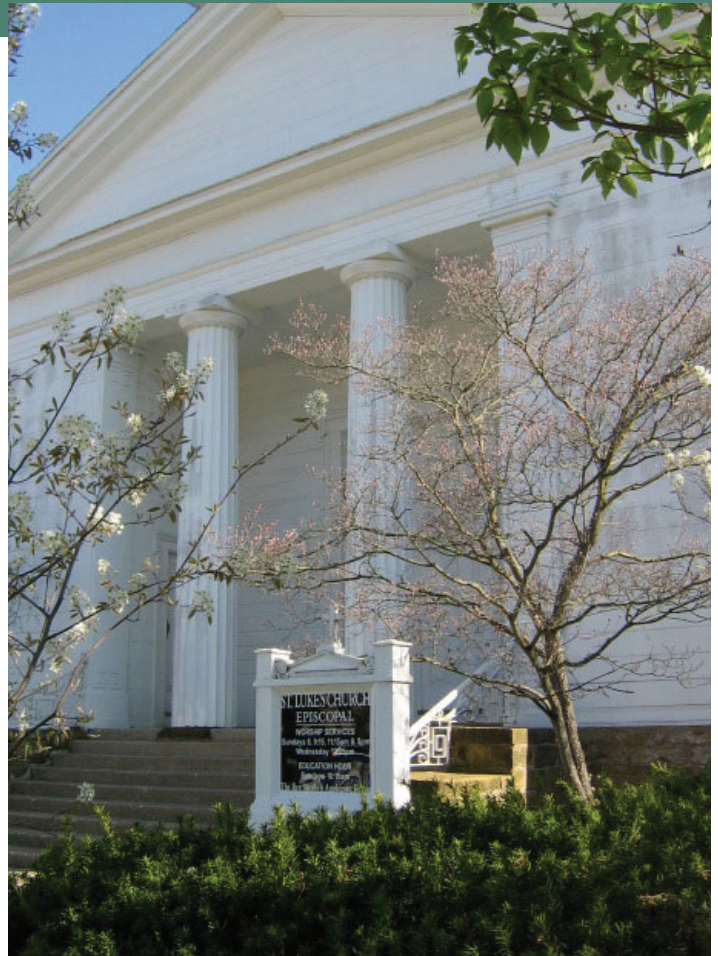

THE PULSE OF THE PARISH

At its September 13, 2011 meeting, the Vestry...

- opted to formally delay the outside audit for one year for budgetary reasons. Operating year 2012 would be subject to an independent audit in 2013;
- reviewed the first pass of a 2012 Operating Budget;
- provided input to the Stewardship Committee relative to the elements of this year's pledge campaign;
- received the following reports: **Rector** – The Blessing of the Backpacks and Parish Celebration on August 28 was a huge success. **Susan Johnson** chaired the event and was helped by a great committee: **Henry & Kim Zaborniak, Charla Devine, Amanda Schneider, Burge and Mary Evans,** and **Sally McClaskey.** The ten o'clock service was very well attended with lots of kids – about 175 in all. Take advantage of current tax law to support your favorite charity before the end of the year

As we move to the last quarter of 2011, St. Luke's Finance Committee member and Merrill Lynch Financial Advisor, Pat Ford, offers this tip for seniors who wish to make charitable contributions before December 31, 2011:

Current tax law allows anyone age 70 1/2 or older to donate up to \$100,000 of their annual required minimum distribution from an IRA directly to a charity, such as St. Luke's, for 2011. The amount of the charitable donation is excluded from your taxable income so transferring the money directly from your IRA to a charity is an easy way to get a tax break for your donation even if you don't itemize your deductions.

To be eligible, the money must be transferred directly from your IRA to St. Luke's. Don't make the mistake of taking a distribution from your IRA and then writing a check to St. Luke's. If you do, you'll owe taxes on the entire distribution unless you itemize your deductions.

Because the transfer must be made directly, your IRA administrator must make out the check to St. Luke's. So contact your bank, brokerage firm or mutual fund company for directions on making the transfer. Most people choose to have the check mailed to their own address, even though it is payable to the charity, so that they can deliver it themselves. Contact your tax preparer or CPA to see if this strategy makes sense for you.

LOOKING AHEAD TO ALL SAINTS' DAY OBSERVANCES AT ST. LUKE'S

Halloween was originally All Hallows E'en – the night before All Saints' Day – the day when the church remembered all the saints – and All Souls' Day – when the church remembers all the faithful departed.

For many years, we have combined the observance of All Saints' and All Souls' Days remembering those parish members who have died during the past year and others by reading their names antiphonally from the four corners of the church before the 11:15 am Sunday service. It is appropriate that we remember the dead – those whom we love but see no longer – those who have played a significant role in our lives. I was made aware of this again on the morning of September 11 when I listened to the names being read of the victims of the terrorist attacks on 9/11 and watched as family members and friends walked along the walls surrounding the pools of water at Ground Zero looking for the name of a father, a wife, a brother, a husband, or a co-worker.

The question that has been on my mind is how best to honor the memories of our dead at St. Luke's during the

Halloween-All Saints'-All Souls' season? Could we include the 8:00 and 9:15 congregations more fully? Could we reduce the labor-intensive process of compiling and organizing the names in preparation for reading them? Could we do something different from what "we've always done" and still honor those who have gone before? The answer to these questions is "yes."

While we have not put the final touches on exactly how we will remember those who have died, we know that it will be a visual memorial in the church rather than an auditory one. We have been looking at how other cultures honor their dead and are especially intrigued by the colorful ways in which our neighbors to the south in Mexico have observed Día de los Muertos – The Day of the Dead.

In the coming weeks, watch for more information about our observances at all three services on October 30. And let us know what you think as we seek a new way to express our cherished values.
